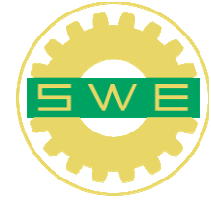

Book Review

Getting Green Done (Hard Truths from the Front Lines of the Sustainability Revolution)

If you want to read a book illustrating where the rubber meets the road in the sustainability field, this one is it. Author Auden Schendler is the executive director of sustainability at Aspen Skiing Company. His humorous stories of failed projects keep reminding you that even when a sustainable project might be cost effective you still have to plan for human nature and expectations, lots of red tape, inexperienced installers, etc. He encourages the concept of businesses focusing their efforts where they can get the biggest bang for the buck like greening their supply chain or improving products, rather than chasing the “low hanging fruit” of LEED certified buildings or using recycled paper. Would you have said that “greenwashing” (when a company touts their useless environmental programs) is good for the environment? Mr. Schendler makes a good case for it, including the concept of forming green momentum in an industry and the extra scrutiny, criticism, and advice that is poured on any company with a green campaign. A thoroughly good read, I would recommend this book to anyone who wants to think about what their focus should be. Are you just picking the low hanging fruit? Or are you paving the way for a culture change?

University of Idaho Dinner with the Dean

System Safety Oversight (SSO) personnel oversee contractor management of safety systems at DOE defense nuclear facilities. SSO are responsible for overseeing assigned systems to ensure they will perform as required by the safety basis and other applicable requirements.

Facility Representative’s (FR) are DOE staff personnel assigned to oversee the day-to-day contractor operations at DOE’s hazardous nuclear and non-nuclear facilities. Oversight performed by FRs provides accurate, objective information on the effectiveness of contractor work performance and practices.
